Back in September we had hoped that the worst of the Covid pandemic was over and we could begin to return to a more normal school structure. However, we have experienced lengthy regional and national lockdowns that meant we moved to distance learning from December to March this year.

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Covid rules and guidelines for September

When we come back in September we are looking forward to Welsh Government relaxing some of the Covid rules we have had to follow. We are awaiting final details but at present the guidance from the local authority is;

- We will no longer be recommending the routine use of face coverings in classrooms
- Face coverings are recommended in indoor communal areas such as corridors.
- Contact groups/bubbles will no longer be recommended. However, we will use our TTP system in order to identify close contacts of learners who have tested positive, and TTP may contact the school to supplement the information they have gathered with any further intelligence you may have available.
- The expectation for school is that we follow the specific advice you receive from TTP about whether individuals need to self-isolate.
- Normal session times will resume.
- Secondary school children and education workforce should be encouraged to test before returning to school.
