The Welsh Government's position is that 'nothing is so essential as universal access to, and acquisition of, the experiences, knowledge and skills that our young people need for employment, lifelong learning and active citizenship', and we agree! At Morriston Comprehensive School, we provide a place of learning and formation for our children and young people where areas of strength are nurtured to become areas of excellence, and all are encouraged to realise their potential. Here, success is the expectation and the norm!

Throughout 2020-2022 we took time to listen and engage with our learners, their families and carers, staff, governors and community leaders to understand our local intentions and review our curriculum priorities. We collated and summarised this information to produce our curriculum design plan and met with our Governing Body, the Pupil Leadership Team, representatives from the regional consortia and Welsh Government to ratify and quality assure each phase of our work to refine our curriculum. During professional learning and InSET sessions, our staff undertook reading and research to plan, design, construct and prepare our new curriculum for teaching in September 2022.

During the Spring term of 2022 we worked with all of our partner primary schools to develop the 3-16 learning continuum and this work remains a priority as we continue to hold our curriculum arrangement planning under review. Not because it's not good enough, but because we know that we can always become better!

Our school curriculum is designed to meet the needs and aspirations of all learners and will enable them to realise the four purposes. It takes account of and responds to the unique opportunities and challenges that present themselves to individuals and groups of learners in our school. Our school curriculum is broad and balanced and includes learning opportunities within and across all of the Areas of learning and experience.

It encompasses the concepts in all of the statements of what matters and provides appropriate progression in accord with the principles of progression. It also aligns to the mandatory requirements of teaching Welsh, English and Religion, Values and Ethics (RVE). The mandatory elements of Relationship and Sexuality Education (RSE) and the cross curricular skills of literacy, numeracy and digital competence are embedded throughout the curriculum.

At Morriston Comprehensive, we believe progression and assessment is fundamental in ensuring we achieve our school vision. Our school curriculum is underpinned by the mandatory principles of progression which describe what it means for learners to progress and the capacities and behaviours our staff will seek to support, regardless of a learners' stage of development. Our assessment arrangements are informed by these principles of progression. We use a variety of evidence informed assessment strategies to enable each individual learner to make progress at an appropriate pace. We call this responsive teaching. We ensure our processes identify learners who require further support or challenge and provide rich qualitative intelligence for us to inform next steps in learning for individuals and groups of learners. Our assessment arrangements ensure active engagement between learners and teachers and is based on ongoing reflection, helping learners to know their strengths, what their next steps are in learning and what is required to support them in achieving excellence.
