

This is a big hit with our students who love decorating the cakes and cookies they bring, playing their games etc and utilising the advice and support they offer.

Year 13 Business

Year 13 attended a workshop on Exam preparation for their upcoming BTEC level 3 Business examination in Personal and Business Finance. The workshop was held at the Vue Cinema in Birmingham. The students were part of a group of around 200 students who worked through different sessions focusing on the paper itself and types of questions expected in the actual exam. They took part in workshop style learning and felt that, overall, the day left them much more aware and prepared for



their exam in January. We hope to run the trip again to help our next group of Business students with their studies.

Business is a useful and practical subject suitable for students who are interested in the world of business, entrepreneurship and marketing. At both levels in KS4 and 5, students have the opportunity to work on course-based topics such as marketing, business planning, recruitment and personal and business finance. It is an ideal option for those wishing to go into any aspect of business such as HR, marketing, entrepreneurship or finance. Sixth Form

The Sixth Form at Morriston has had a number of excellent speakers this year including talks on jobs in the NHS, jobs in Public Services and opportunities in the RAF. A number of our Media Studies students had the opportunity to attend a film making course with the British Film Industry over half-term which they thoroughly enjoyed. Some of our history students had the chance to speak to Lord Burrows live from London via a Zoom link. They were able to ask the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court questions about their aspirations to study law in


